

PARKRUN REDDITCH

Looking for a new way to kick-start your weekend? Enjoy running? Want to find a great way of keeping fit in a fun, social and friendly environment? If your answer is yes to any of those then





Parkrun organise free, weekly, 5km timed runs around the world and there is one at the Arrow Valley Lake every Saturday morning. They are open to everyone, they are **free**, and are safe and easy to take part in.

We encourage people of every ability to take part; from those taking their first steps in running to Olympians; from juniors to those ore seasoned runners; we welcome you all. It really is an event for everyone and is in no way a 'race.' You simply run/jog/walk (or a mixture of all!) for your own enjoyment and the personal challenge of getting a new personal best.

The Redditch event is a lovely two lap course which is mostly flat! Recently we have celebrated the 100th event and also Redditch Parkrun's 2nd birthday. The event has grown and grown to an average of 200 people running each week aged from 8-80! A dedicated team of volunteers marshal the course, time your run and generally offer encouragement to runners.

It has been brilliant to see so many THS pupils attending Parkrun on a regular basis, 9am is an early start whatever the weather but the dedication showed by around 10-12 pupils has seen a vast improvement on their times. For junior runners (under 18's) there is also a free tee-shirt once you have completed 10 runs. Some of these pupils are using this towards their DofE physical section and it is also a brilliant volunteering opportunity in your local community.
